

About the UNECE



- Set up in 1947 to promote pan-European economic integration
- One of five regional commissions of the UN
- 56 Member States: Europe, North America, Asia
- Approx 180 staff
- Reports directly to UN Secretary-General






UNECE in the UN System



ECOSOC gives a mandate to:

- Functional Commissions, e.g. UNSC
- 5 Regional Commissions, e.g. UNECE
- Other initiatives, e.g. UN-GGIM



A new mandate



- July 2016 ECOSOC Resolution:
 - "requests that the regional commissions provide relevant support, upon request and as appropriate, to the work of the regional bodies of UN-GGIM"
- January 2017 UN-GGIM Europe ExCom
- June 2017 CES Plenary Session
 - "recognized the importance of joint work between statisticians and geospatial experts
 - "supported greater collaboration between UNECE and UN-GGIM: Europe"

Building a new partnership



- Discussions with UN-GGIM: Europe Chair and Executive Committee
- Agreed proposal for greater collaboration
- Approved at the political level by the UNECE Executive Committee



Strategic areas for collaboration



- Geospatial information for sustainable development
- Building networks and promoting communication
- Integration of geospatial, statistical and other information
- Involvement of other UNECE work programmes
- Capacity development

Why is this collaboration important?



- Sustainable Development Goals
- Growing interest and pressure from UNECE member countries
- Demand for workshops and capacity development activities

What can we achieve together? 1) Fostering national partnerships

- UNECE
- Geospatial and statistical information are two key parts of a national data infrastructure
- Integrating geospatial and statistical data is more of an organisational challenge than a technical challenge
- Build on good examples of partnerships and collaboration, e.g. Ireland

What can we achieve together? 2) Satellite images
