The aim of UN-GGIM: Europe

The aim of UN-GGIM: Europe work is to ensure that the **national mapping and** cadastral authorities and national statistical institutes in the European UN Member States, the European Institutions and associated bodies work together to contribute to the more effective management and availability of geospatial information in Europe, and its integration with other information, based on user needs and requirements





The role of UN-GGIM: Europe

Providing support to the further implementation and alignment of existing legislation, to support relevant ongoing initiatives and proposing actions, to be implemented as far as possible within existing legal, institutional and operational frameworks.





Establishing UN-GGIM: Europe

- An inaugural phase
 - November 2012 until October 2013
- A transitional phase
 - UN-GGIM3 July 2013 until UN-GGIM4 August 2014
- An operational phase (current phase)
 - following the official establishment of UN-GGIM: Europe on 1st October 2014 in Chisinau, Moldova.



Operational Phase

- Currently in the operational phase
- Next two years until 2016 a number of challenges ahead
- Review by ECOSCO in 2016





Challenge ahead:

- Achieve true cooperation between NMCAs and NSIs
 - Joint geospatial-statistical information systems are needed to inform evidencebased decision making:
 - Globally for example the achievement of the forthcoming Sustainable Development Goals
 - Regionally for example the Europe 2020 strategy



Challenge ahead:

- Ensure the highest possible level of active participation from other communities
 - Raise interest from observing bodies, currently four organisations granted observer status in UN-GGIM: Europe
 - The European Commission is granted permanent observer status in the Articles of UN-GGIM: Europe.

Challenge ahead:

- Ensure that the regional efforts of UN-GGIM: Europe contribute to the global initiative
 - GGRF resolution adopted by the United Nations General Assembly 26/2/2015
 - Active role in the Global Working Groups
 - European mature experience in geospatial management



Work plan 2015 - 2017

- The work plan mainly focuses on two objectives:
 - Increasing data interoperability and harmonisation by proposing core geospatial data which meats essential user needs
 - Enabling integration of care geospatial data with other data in order to foster further usage
- The timetable is envisaged to give tangible results in time for the ECOSOC evaluation of UN-GGIM initiative in 2016



Practical Execution of Work Plan

- Work Group A, Core Data: deal with core data specifications and quality, production issues, funding and data availability
- Work Group B, Data Integration: deal with the integration of geospatial data (including cadastral parcels) with other information
- Secretariat: Supporting, facilitating and executing the actions of the Executive Committee


