- ☐ The UN-GGIM-AP continues supporting Member States in advancing the operationalization of the GSGF and IGIF.
- Main Activities
 - 1. Coordinating, guiding and taking the lead in the work and activities of UN-GGIM-AP working groups;
 - 2. Coordinating and facilitating joint activities with UN-GGIM for the furtherance of its program of work;
 - 3. Planning, coordinating and convening annual plenary meetings of UN-GGIM-AP;
 - 4. Planning, coordinating and convening annual meetings of the Executive Board;
 - 5. Preparing reports to sessions of UN-GGIM and plenary meetings of UN-GGIM-AP.

WG 1: GEODETIC REFERENCE FRAME

 Working on sustaining the UN General Assembly Resolution, "The Global Geodetic Reference Frame (GGRF) for Sustainable Development"

Asia Pacific Reference Frame (APREF)

- Realized by continuous GNSS observation of over 700 stations in over 28 countries

International Height Reference Frame (IHRF)

- Global Geodetic Observing System (GGOS) Focus Area: Unified Height System has been working to establish International Height Reference Frame (IHRF)
- IHRF-related geodetic capacity development such as sharing of knowledge and expertise could be one
 of focuses of WG1 in this term

Capacity Building

- UN-GGIM-AP/IAG/FIG/BIG Workshop on Geodetic Reference Frames and Applications for Disaster on November 7th, 2023 in Bali, Indonesia
- Participate in geodetic capacity development events in 2024

WG 2: CADASTRE AND MANAGEMENT

- **Recognizing** the importance of Expert Group on Land Administration and Management (EG- LAM)'s strategic work plan 2023-2035
- *Implementing* the Framework for Effective Land Administration (FELA) at the national level and in collaboration with regional committees, functional groups and international organizations
- **Recognizing** leveraging synergies, avoid duplication through collaboration with other working groups of UN-GGIM-AP; and international organizations, such as FIG
- **Identifies** and shares diverse forms of forum for dialogue and coordination to strengthen human capacity building related to innovation in cadaster, land administration and management for sustainability and resilience;
- Requests the Secretariat to continue to explore possible options (in a cost-neutral manner) for building UN-GGIM-AP geospatial information service center with all interested Member States for practical provision of geospatial services and products to member countries of UN-GGIM-AP, considering cooperation with the United Nations GIS Service
 Centre of the United Nations Office on ICT (UN OICT) in Brindisi, Italy.

WG 3: INTEGRATING GI AND STATISTICS

- **Promoting** the use of standards and sharing common literature for integration of geospatial information and statistics
- **Strengthening** the collaborative national arrangement between Geospatial and Statistical Agencies in the AP Region
- Advancing adoption of GSGF principles in Asia-Pacific Region
- Contribution to SDGs with the help of integrating geospatial statistics
- **Sharing** case studies of integrating geospatial and statistical information for effective Natural Disaster Management
- Strengthening ties with the United Nations Expert Group on the Integration of Statistical and Geospatial Information (joint meeting the EG-ISGI and WG3)

Workplan 2024-2025

- a) To increase IGIF Awareness activities by member countries
- b) To organize virtual (online) workshop for basic understanding about IGIF & Country Action Plan
- c) To prepare some good resources for better outreach
- d) To organize three workshops covering three IGIF Strategic Pathways in each workshop
- e) To coordinate with HLG-IGIF for capacity building activities & resource
- f) To prepare IGIF Baseline Assessment for UN-GGIM-AP member countries

CHALLENGES

- ☐ Geographical Location, only less 50% of member states (56) are active
- ☐ Small Islands States in the Pacific Region need assistance, due to climate change and other disasters

Inter-Regional Committees Meeting



- to strengthen inter-regional engagement and sharing of information including regional activities, case studies and webinars; keep respective web-sites of regional committees up-to-date and provide web-links to all other regional committees;
- consider inter-regional cooperation including 'bilaterally', i.e., between two regions, aiming at enhancing national geospatial information management and data integration for evidence-based policy-development and accelerating the achievements of national development goals and the SDGs.

A meeting of UN-GGIM Regional Committees for Africa, Americas, Arab States, Asia and the Pacific and Europe, 7 November 2023

Two Decisions:

- 1. to meet, in-person, at least twice a year. Once at the annual sessions of the Committee of Experts each August at UNHQ, and the other, to be hosted by a regional committee, on a rotational basis, during its annual plenary meeting.
- 2. beginning with the fourteenth session, to coordinate the preparation of their joint report to the Committee of Experts under agenda item 4 Contribution of regional committees to the global geospatial information agenda. In this regard, UN-GGIMAP will take the lead for the fourteenth session and thereafter, by another regional committee, again on a rotational basis.
