• Explore ways to contribute and support activities promoting geospatial and statistical data integration, including reinforcing the involvement of the EO community

Sustainable Development Goals

• Maintain the active contribution of UN-GGIM: Europe on showcasing the added value of integrating geospatial data with other data to address SDG indicators

Data Strategy and Policy


The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

Integrated Geospatial Information Framework (UN-IGIF)

Geo-enabling Countries for a Better Future

- IGIF is globally developed and endorsed by the UN-GGIM Committee of Experts
- Helps countries to integrate information about people and their geography
- Enables effective policy formulation, decision-making, and innovation
- Strengthens geospatial information management and related resources
- IGIF helps deliver sustainable social, economic, and environmental development – leaving no one behind



UN-GGIM: Europe UN-IGIF Working Group

The UN-IGIF has quickly become the 'umbrella framework' for the activities of UN-GGIM.

Many of the existing frameworks and global expert and working groups relate to the UN-IGIF.

This line of work supports the regional interests on the HLG-IGIF, provide the views of the European Region as the UN-IGIF matures, and consider activities which will benefit members of UN-GGIM: Europe.

Aim and expected outcomes

- Actively promote the UN-IGIF as a tool and an evaluation system for MS, especially those that already have national frameworks in place.
- Support MS to develop their capabilities and build capacity in country especially enabling them to evaluate and assess the relevance of the UN-IGIF.




