Decision 14/101 Enhancing global geospatial information management arrangements

(b) Appreciated the establishment of a **new and enlarged secretariat for the Committee** of Experts dedicated to the Committee's normative and implementation work on global geospatial information management, and in that regard requested the Secretariat to focus, in particular, on (i) supporting the Bureau to develop a strategic framework for the period 2025–2030, (ii) strengthening effective global coordination and governance arrangements for the United Nations global geospatial centres, and (iii) supporting a global programme of national capacity development aligned with the Committee's operations focused on the Sustainable Development Goals and the United Nations Integrated Geospatial Information Framework;

- In March 2025, UN Secretary-General António Guterres announced the launch of <u>UN80</u>, a comprehensive reform agenda aimed at ensuring the institution remains fit for purpose as it enters its 80th year.
 - streamline operations,
 - realign mandates
 - shift some functions from pricier locales like New York City to lower-cost locations like Nairobi.
- Response to a financial crisis that's squeezing the organization.
- As of May 2025, only 104 of 194 UN Member States have paid their regular budget assessments.
- "The liquidity crisis is caused by one simple fact arrears... essentially one member state and a few others." (Guterres speech to Member States on May 12)
 - U.S. <u>owes \$1.5 billion in outstanding payments</u>.
 - China, the second-largest contributor, has delayed its payments, too.
- The result is hiring freezes, program cuts and uncertainty.

UN80 impact on UN-GGIM

- 99 posts will be cut from UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN DESA)
- The focus is on retaining existing staff
- Unfilled positions are vulnerable
- The initial proposal to the Under Sec. Gen. of UN DESA may have 4-5 unfilled positions from the UN-GGIM Secretariat offered up along with a narrative*.
- No decision until December 2025 when the Member States decide as part of the budget process
- Member States to decide how to use this information for discussion within their governments

***UN80 impact on UN-GGIM narrative**

Diminishing geospatial information management arrangements

 Delays in implementing ECOSOC resolution 2024/22 including threats to capacity development associated with gaps in the coordination, knowledge-sharing, resources and impact of the performance of planned number of countries that developed country action plans on geospatial based on the UN Integrated Geospatial Information Framework.

Absence of strengthened Headquarters accountability for the geospatial programme

Depriving the geospatial programme of oversight and enhanced authority at the Headquarters level would result in lack of internal control mechanism, coherence and clarity regarding the roles and responsibilities including related to coordination, compliance and monitoring of activities in offices away from headquarters (i.e. Geospatial Centres of Excellence in Deqing, Bonn and upcoming Riyadh).

(f) Recommended a **dedicated and easily accessible web presence** for the United Nations Global Geospatial Knowledge and Innovation Centre on the website of the Committee of Experts, alongside the links to the United Nations Global Geodetic Centre of Excellence and the United Nations Integrated Geospatial Information Framework;

(g) Requested the Bureau, with the support of the Secretariat, to initiate preparations for the Third United Nations **World Geospatial Information Congress**, to be convened after the sixteenth session of the Committee of Experts, in 2026, and to report back to the Committee at its fifteenth session;

(e) Also acknowledged the importance of ensuring the currency of and translating and **publishing the Framework suite of documents and resource materials to facilitate the implementation of the Framework by countries**, and in that regard appreciated the translation efforts undertaken by a task team comprising volunteer translators from Member States and the United Nations Global Geospatial Information Management regional committees and Academic Network, and requested the Bureau to consider a translators network, as a thematic network of the Committee of Experts, dedicated to the translation of the Committee's documents

Publishing the Framework suite of documents and resource materials

Part 1: Overarching Strategy

Part 1 : Overarching Strategy sets the context of 'why' geospatial information management needs to be strengthened and why it is a critical element of national social, economic and environmental development. It focusses on the role of geospatial information in the digital age and how that information is integral to government functions at all levels. The Overarching Strategy communicates this via vision and mission statements, seven (7) underpinning principles, eight (8) goals and nine (9) strategic pathways, all of which are aligned to strategic national to global drivers. The roadmap for implementing the Framework occurs primarily through the nine strategic pathways. These lead to an approach that considers national circumstances, priorities and perspectives as a means for governments to establish more effective geospatial information management arrangements.
